A long tree was seen in the darkness to be overhanging the river, after the manner of a sweep, and the travelers caught it as they passed and pulled themselves into its branches. Bell had to assist Richardson to shore, as his frozen clothes disabled him from climbing. They followed down on the shore until the ice jammed again half a mile below, where the dogs jumped ashore; but had seen no more of the mail, etc., at the time they forwarded their report.
