

New Automobile Laws

No paid chauffeur shall operate without a license from the provincial secretary, under instructions to be fixed. No person under seventeen shall drive a motor vehicle.

If horse appears frightened, or if motor is signalled to, motor shall stop, until horse passes, and operator shall render all possible assistance. Meeting a funeral, the motor shall turn down a lane.

Man in motor must give name and address without being asked to person sustaining loss or injury. Provincial secretary may revoke licenses.

COLOR PHOTOGRAPHY

Charleston (W. Va.) Mail

After a great deal of experimenting on a long sought-for object, the Lyons-Cochrane Studio, of this city, has made successful color plates after the wonderful Lumiere process. This is the first successful color-work produced in this part of the country, and these artists claim that, under certain conditions of light and heat, now well known the desired results are sure. The plates made Sunday were of fruits and flowers. Not only were the different colors perfectly duplicated but they combined the different shades or tints of natural scenery. With nearly all other colors, the yellows are particularly shown in 6 or 7 different tints. At present the process is very complicated and expensive, but within a very short time this well known firm will place color work on the market, and, within a very few days will have on display plates of persons, depicting in true colors and tints the gaudy dress, the ruddy complexion, the golden tress, and the fancy "Merry Widow."

Mr. J. B. Lyons of the above firm is a native of Newboro, Ont., this County. He attended high school here and finished in 1901. After teaching a few years he went to Illinois State where he took a graduate course in the art of photography. After leaving Illinois he operated studios in Richmond, Virginia, and Clarksburg, West Virginia. In 1905 he married a young noted artist of Charleston, West Va., and finally in the fall of 1907 they went to that city of 30,000 people, the capital of the state, and there opened an up-to-date studio, built after their own plans. Nothing but success was met, and in 1907 they took into the firm, Friend Cochrane, of that city, and these artists make up the Lyons-Cochrane Studio spoken of in above clipping. This studio is one of the best in the Southern States.

KEEP A RECORD

If you have never kept a record of the yield of a cow in your herd, you can't begin too soon. It is the only safe way of going about the business shows just what each cow does, and is the only safe gauge to her performance.

Besides this, it helps the feeder to judge the results of his feeding. Suppose, for instance, you are starting to get the milk production of your cow increased in the fall when placed in the stable after the flies and other things have ceased from troubling them. You try by increased feeding to gain this end. By weighing the milk you will absolutely know what results you are getting.

If they are not satisfactory, you can try a change in feeding. If you have been feeding grain with a little benefit and much expenditure of grain, you cannot find this out too quickly. By substituting some other ration you may at once accomplish what you are looking for. If you continue to increase rations, you will be willing to stop the increase as soon as you find that further increase no longer increases the flow of milk. In every case you at once know where you are at. Some times too, weighing the milk will excite a little rivalry in the matter of getting large milk production. Your neighbor may try to beat you out and your herdsmen may try to beat your neighbor's herdsmen in the matter of getting better results. This will mean that there will be no milk lost through carelessness. Where a good record of this kind is kept a stranger can walk into the stable and tell more about what a herd is doing than the manager himself knows where it is not.
