## LIFE, LIBERTY AND EN: JOYMENT.

## To the Editor of the Acadias.

If I am not astray, the abore words figure prominently in the Deelaration of Independence of our Republican neighbers ; and it is deelared in that neighbers; and it is declared inetrument that the things edebrated inatrument that the things
represented by the werds are the inaliesable rights of men, asd, I suppose, of mortals in general. I could not belp thinking of the words a few days ago as I was passing through the streete of Wolfville. And was reaching the enoWolfrile. And subjeets of the Britich Crown sometimes hold opinions similar Crown sometimes hold opinioas similar to those of "f
What led me to the conclusion تas the pleasing sight of the numerous cattle of all sines, ages and colors, "ringstaked, spotted and speckled," black, shite, grey and brown, with a sprinkling of horses, sheep and swine, thich in the exercise of liberty ware perambulating the streets of the beautiful and classie village, of which the AcsDtar is doulcless not a little proud, and descrveliy so.
And to say the truth, it ras pleasant to see bow happy the eattile were in the enjoyment of "Iffe and liberty" -browsing in the gutters, "ebering the eud of cootentanent," and exlivecing the quict village vith their melodious lowings, "sole and reaponsire," as Miltoo has it, when treating of another kind of music.
In making some such remark to ${ }^{2}$ emmpenion of my wanderings, I was is-
formed that the cattle had good reasoo to be happy and thankful as well, for that the authorities had taken them under their expecial charge, and appeinted a Board of Offieers, called Street Guardians, or something of the kind, ane of whose duties was to see thast the bovines were not molested, or the'r liberty restrieted; and he went on to say thas a member of the Board was specially appointed with this end in view, as he had in the past secured the nexiable reputation, both by words and deeds, of promoting to the extent of his influenoe, this mont desirable and enjoyable liberty of the good cattle. My companion proeeeded to say in addition that in ooe or two of the appointments, the dispenser of patrocage had prolabIv another "string to his bow "" for an Election, was looming up in the near futare and as ooe of the great political partics of the Province were represented on the Board, it would be a masterly atroke of poliey to confer like hooor on the other, and thereby secure its good will and assiitanee in the enming onetest-in which my informant stated, the dignitary had a most landable personal interest. By the way this coquetting, whether in love or polities, is a rery pleasant avd interesting cecupation, and sbows an amount of sagacity which desertes the most abuendant suecess.

In this partienlar case, to secomplish the desired object, it was nceessary to resort to unusual expedients. He fasteved to his "leathern girdle" as many "stene bottlos" on oee side as on the other. And so in the case before us; by increasing the number of cffoers from three to four, each political party would have an equal representation. All will admit that this was eminently wise and worthy of 3 politician.
But I have rather wapdered from my subject, and as newspaper artieles must be brief, I will not pick up the threads of my disoourse, but merely express the wish that the cattle may still be allowed to roam unmolested, in the fall enjoyment of the liberty which is their present happy lot and portion; ooly bespeaking from your indulgence the privilege of referring ou a future oceasion to some other eatimable usages and peealiarities of your bvelyand noted vilage.
