C. P. R. PURCHASES PROPERTY

On Saturday the Canadian Pacific Railway purchased all the land south of their track property at Woodstock, formerly owned by the Dominion Tanneries, Ltd. and the Anglo-Canadian Leather Company, and four acres of adjoining land owned by C. L. Smith. The C. P. R. has also appropriated \$20,000 for laying out new tracks, the work to commence early in the spring. Supt. When the new track is laid out all through trains of 40 cars or more can pass through on a straight track without being broken up, and much yard room will be available for other purposes.—Press.
