CANADIAN CONSTITUTION.

Motion Brought Up in Quebec Legislature to Make Radical Changes in British North America Act.

GOVERNMENT BELIEVED TO BE BEHIND IT.

Quebec, Feb. 22.—A notice of motion given last evening by Mr. Morris Perreault, member for Cham-bay, has created a sensation in political circles. The motion is as follows: That the opinion of the House be expressed as to the propriety of the British North America Act as it stands, and as to the expediency of giving the necessary aid to colonization, to agriculture, to the development of our industries, and the improvement of our educational system. That the interpretation given to various clauses of the constitution has endangered the existence of our local institutions, and that the Government of Canada and those of the other Provinces should be invited to join the Govern-

ment of the Province of Quebec in asking the Parliament of the United Kingdom to make such changes in the Federation Act as may alter the basis on which the Federal subsidy is calculated, and secure to the province an exclusive control over their public properties, and over the railways within their limits, allow of the imposing of export duties on the products of their forests and mines, and confer upon the government of Great Britain the right of disallowing Provincial law, now exercised by that of Canada.

There is a current belief here that this motion is of ministerial inspiration, and that consequently it will be adopted by a majority vote of the House.

ELECTION PROTEST.

Mr. Bergeron Has Petitioned Against Return of Mr. Brunet.

MONTREAL, Feb. 22.—J. G. H. Bergeron has filed a petition contesting the election of Brunet, Liberal, in St. James Division, Montreal, in the petition ballot box stuffing, perjury, intimidation and all kinds of corruption are charged.

HEAVY SENTENCES.

Parties Found Guilty of Complicity in Bank of Liverpool Frauds.

LONDON, Feb. 22.—Sentences were today pronounced on the prisoners found guilty of complicity in the Bank of Liverpool frauds. Thomas F. Goudie, the book keeper of the Bank, and Dick Budge, the pugilist, were each sentenced to ten years' imprisonment. Ed F. Kelly, a bookmaker of Broad Street, and Stiles, another bookmaker, each received two years.

FISH BY EXPRESS.

Experimental Shipment of the British Columbia Product to Boston.

VANCOUVER, Feb. 22.—The Halibut express, comprising nine cars of fresh halibut, one car of Puget Sound salmon, and one car of Squamish Valley hops, has left here for Boston. This is the first through fish train to run from the Pacific to the Atlantic. It will make the same time as the passenger express. The fish will be landed in Boston on Monday morning.

KING'S NOMINATION.

O. P. King and F. M. Sprout Nominated Speeches by Candidates and Others.

HAMPTON, Feb. 22.—The nomination proceedings here today to nominate candidates for the House of Assembly are attended by a great crowd of electors and much interest seems to be taken in the contest. Ora P. King, government, and Fred M. Sprout were nominated. Speech making began at 2 o'clock, addresses being delivered by the candidates Attorney General Piquette, J. D. Hazen, leader of the opposition, and G. G. Scott, M. P. Considerable comment is occasioned by the absence from the nomination proceedings of Col. Donville.

SPANISH RIOTS.

MADRID, Feb. 22.—Agitators are actively preparing the declaration of a great strike here Feb. 24, in support of the strikers in Barcelona.

Advice from Valencia say that the strike there has been suppressed, but that the workmen are clamoring for the release of their arrested comrades. At Barcelona the captain general has allowed the rioters three days to deliver all their arms. After the expiration of that time any person found in possession of arms will be tried by drumhead. Court martial orders have been issued to all the soldiers to close at 7 o'clock in the evening; citizens are not allowed to be out of their residences after 8 p. m.
