

Grave Injustice Has Been Done



A sensational divorce case pending in the New York courts is that of Charles E. Smith, sales manager of the Knickerbocker Sales Company. From the original action which he brought against his wife, Mrs. Clara W. Smith, has developed an allegation of affection suit for \$50,000 damages against James R. Gilmore, president of the Sheppard Knapp Carpet Company. Mr. Gilmore is named as co-defendant and with Mrs. Smith is made codefendant. The suit will be vigorously resisted in the courts. Although Mr. Gilmore declares that the action filed against him is based on misrepresentation and that a grave injustice has been done the woman as well as to himself, Mr. Smith says that he trailed his wife and Mr. Gilmore to the woman's apartment at one o'clock one morning, and that when a friend broke down the door he found Mr. Gilmore in a bathtub and Mrs. Smith in negligee.

SYNOPSIS OF DOMINION LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-agency for the district, or by proxy if he is unable to appear in person, on certain conditions by letter, mother, son, daughter, widow or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, more or less, in certain districts, a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section anywhere in the Dominion. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to erect a homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$2000.
