Meeting of the Miramichi Presbytery

The quarterly meeting of the Presbytery of Miramich was held in St. James Hall, Newcastle, on uesiay. There was a good attendance and an important docket of business was transacted. There we e pre ent Rev. Thos. Harrison Hugh Miller, Er. D. B. Wyllie, J. J. H. A. Anderson, J. H. McLein, Alex. Firth, L. J King, B. H. Penwarden, F. W. Thompson, W. M. Matthews, L. H. Wallean, Alix. McKay, G. S. Gard rer, G. P. Tattrie, A. J. MacNeill, J. F. McCirdy, H. S. Raynor, B. C. Salter, ministers and Mesers E. A. McCurdy, John A. McNaughton and J. O. Sherer, elders.

The election of officers for the ensuing six months resulted in Dr. E. B. Wyllie being elected Moderator, Fer. W. M. Matthews re-elected treasures.

The first matter taken up was the report on Home Missions by the c nvenor of the committee, Rev. J. F. McCurdy. Good work had been done by the students in the various mission fields, H. Y. Ch., in Mill Bank, Russelville and Oak Point; Victor Wals in Kouchibouguac, T. H. Whelpley in Matapedia and Linden Crocker for a f. w weeks in Miscou and Shippegan. All of these fields had met the financial requirements and there were no bills unpaid to submit to Presbytery.

A pleasing feature of the proceedings was a fraternal visit from Rev Dr. Steel, superintendent of Home Missions in the Methodist Church and Rev. J. B. Champion of the Meth edist Church in Newcastle, both of whom were invited to sit as corres poading members of the court. Steel addres ei the Presbytery, out-lining what was being done particularly in Nova Scotia in the matter of co-operation between the Presbyterian and Methodist courches to avoid undue overlapping. The committee of Presbyte v on cooperation Revs. Hugh Miller, J. F. McCurdy and W. M. Matthews, has been at work for some time securing information This committee met on Tueslay with a similar committee represent ing the Methodist and came to a cordial agreement in a ge eral survey of the whole constituency and possible readjustme ts of the work. Rev. J. H. A. Anderson convener of he committee on Sabbath Scho list and Young People's Societies, brought in the finding of the committee on the better administration of the Sacrament of Infant Bartism, which had been remitted to then at a former meeting. The recommendation with some modification was adopted emphasizing the importance of its administrations at public worship and in the presence of the congregation, the need for fuller instruction as to its significance, and overtuing the General Assembly to give a deliverance on the whole question and provide suitable literature available for the general instructions of the Church at large.

Rev J. H. McLean submitted the allocations of the m'ssion budget to the several congregations of the bounds for 1921. Fart of the financial outlook in the Forward Movement is the steady increase of revilar missionary givings so that the whole budget shall be doubled in five years. The allocation to the Presbytery for 1921 is \$14,000. Rev. Alex. McKay piesented a call from the congregation of New Carlisle, P. Q., addressed to Rev. J. S. McCurdy who has been eighteen months under apcointment there as or lained missionary. The call was supported by Mr. J. O. Sherer from the congregation, sustained by the Presbytery as a regular Gospel call and placed in the hands of Mr. McCurdy who intimated his acceptance of the same. The induction was set for Dec. 29, the Presbytery to meet in New Carlisle Church at 7.30 p. m. Rev. A. McKay was appointed to preside and induct Rev. Mr. McKay to address the miniser and Rev. L. J. King the people. Rev. B. O. Saiter, H. Miller and L. J. King were appointed a committee to consider the remits sent down from the General Assembly and report to the March meeting. Rev. J. H. A. 
