It is hereby ordered by the Minister of Shipping under the powers conferred upon him by clause 9 of the Coal Order of 1st December, 1919, that so far as they apply to home consumption, the following clauses of the said coal order are suspended until further notice, namely, clauses 1, 2, 7 and 10.

The bunkering of foreign going vessels or vessels of foreign register will remain under the control of the Minister of Shipping, and must not be supplied with coal by any vendor without first having obtained a permit to do so from the Minister of Shipping.
