

Referring to the cry raised because there is no Irish Catholic in the new Cabinet, the London Advertiser says: We hold the opinion that these constant enquiries as to nationality are unpatriotic and uncalculated for the benefit of the nation. This is in Canada, not Ireland or England. If we are ever to become anything as a people it must be by merging all nationalities—English, French, Irish, Scotch, German—into the one nationality of Canada. Are we to be everlastingly kicking up a Donnybrook rumpus in Canada as to the respective merits of Dutchmen, Frenchmen, Irishmen, Englishmen and Scotchmen? It is flattering certainly to the great majority of our population, who are Canadian born, that the Mail should bring it against Mr. Scott that he is not a suitable representative of the Catholics of Canada because he was born in Canada, notwithstanding the fact that Canadian-born Catholics outnumber all others.

An indication of the course likely to be taken by the Maritime Provinces was given at the Great John A. banquet. There is no doubt that the smaller members of the Confederation don't like the cold shades of opposition, and won't have them for a permanent residence if they can help it. Mr. Mitchell, in the exuberance of his oration, in his after-dinner speech said he might not merge himself in the future with this Conservative party, great as were its virtues, for his Province might not approve of it, but he should ever maintain that its policy for the last six years—that is, since Mr. Peter Mitchell came over to help them—was such as to deserve the approval of Conservatives and Liberals alike. Hon. Peter Mitchell holds Conservative principles in one hand and Reform in the other, and calls upon the people to pay their money and take their choice.
