The Massachusetts State Board of Health has warned the people of Lawrence against using Merrimac River water for drinking purposes without boiling fifteen minutes. Investigation shows that the prevalence of typhoid fever and kindred diseases there is due to the water. There are more than 200 cases. The Merrimac is the only water supply of the city.

Commander Gordon, of the British Navy, and in charge of the Dominion fishery protective cruisers, recommends that in view of the rapid depletion of the whale fishery in Hudson Bay by American whaling vessels, the Dominion Government should pass legislation closing these waters for a period of ten years. American whaling vessels do a large trading business among the natives in Hudson Bay, paying no duty and coming in competition with the Hudson Bay people who have to pay duty.
