

Zanesville, Ohio, Feb. 11.-A northbound passenger train on the Cincin-nati and Muskingum Valley Railway was wrecked ten miles south of here yesterday. The baggage car left the track at the siding, followed by the smoker and engine, and plunged down a twelve-foot embankment.

Express Messenger Thos. L. Fisher, of Midway, was instantly killed. Engineer Lon Shrigley and Fireman Davis, both of this city, were seriously injured. Three passengers in the moking car, whose names could not be learned, were fatally injured. A misplaced switch caused the ac-cident.

IT WAS MURDER.

Verdict at the George A. Nolan Inquest

Windsor, Feb. 11.-The inquest in the case of George Andrew Nolan, the colored New Canaan farmer, who was supposed to have been poisoned by his wife, resulted in a verdict charging her with murder. The evidence was corroborative of that given two weeks ago, the only new feature being the report of the analysis made by Prof. Ellis, of Toronto, The analyist said that phosphorous had been found in the stomach, and the evidence went to show that the prisoner had repeat-edly threatened to take her husband's life. It was also proved that she had purchased a box of rough on rats in Gesto previous to her husband's death. The jury were out for a couple of hours and brought in a verdict of death from wilful poisoning. Mrs. Nolan will stand trial at the fall assizes, to be held next September.
