TWO WAYS TO DO IT.

Effective Methods of Curing Dangerous Hiccoughs.

One by a Clever Surgical Operation, the Other by Sudden Fright.

NEWARK, N. J., Feb. 15 .- A successful operation was performed by Drs. Grube and Towle upon John Carberry, who has been suffering from a severe attack of hiccoughs for the past eleven weeks. The doctors found that by touching a certain spot under the jaw they could start hiccoughs. This spot was just under the inferior dental branch of the maximiliary nerve, and the theory was that by cutting this nerve its unhealthy or supersensitive action would

no longer be conveyed to the diaphragm. The operation lasted about half an hour. Carberry refused to take ether and joked with the physicians continually. At the close of the operation he expressed himself as feeling greatly relieved, although the hiccoughs still continued in reduced energy. The doctors are highly pleased with their work, and look for the patient's speedy recovery.

EASILY CURED. New York, Feb. 15 .- Jennie Klevousky, 31 years old, of 90 Chrystie street, was taken to Bellevue Hospital suffering from a severe attack of hiccoughs. When she entered the alcoholic ward, to which she was committed, the noise she made could be heard all over the place. It greatly disturbed one of the other patients, who clad in a canvas jacket jumped from her chair and began to yell. Then she rushed at the newcomer. This frightened Mrs. Klevousky so badly that she forgot to hiccough and started for the door. The attack did not return, and she was allowed to leave the hospital that night.

That Obnoxious Treaty. OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 16. - At a meeting of United Temperance Association last evening a motion was carried that a deputation of leading citizens in sympathy with the cause of prohibition wait upon the local members of Parliament with a view of asking them to oppose the French treaty, by which it is proposed to allow-light French wines into Canada at lower rates of duty. It was the unanimous opinion of those present that prohibition could never be obtained if such a measure as the French

treaty were ratified. Stabbing Affray in Ingersoll.

INGERSOLL, Feb. 16 .- A very serious stabbing affair occurred here last night at the Atlantic House. Two men, James Howe, a tinsmith, and Patrick Carollin, a blacksmith, were in the room, when Howe without any provocation whatever walked up to Carrollin and stabbed him in the abdomin. Carrollin is in a very critical condition. Howe also attempted to stab a young man named K. Day, but was overpowered and his knife taken away. Howe is generally very quiet, and his conduct cannot be accounted for in any way.
