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**AUSTRIAN AIRMEN RAID
MANY ITALIAN TOWNS**

BERLIN, June 18, via Saville wire.—A successful raid on hostile military establishments and railway stations in northern Italy by an Austrian army corps was announced in an admiralty statement. Issued in Vienna, as follows:
