



"The society has grown from infancy to sturdy manhood strong and active in the prosecution of the work which has been assigned to it and

"We are indebted as a society to the liberality of the citizens of Lon-don and the county of Middlesex, which enables us to carry on such a necessary and wonderful work. The city council increased its grant to us this year by \$1,000, having in view the additional work that we would be called upon to perform. I would, say, however, that the city council should be asked for a further grant to assist in the greater prosecution of our work.
