win maye to be taken apart by the slow process of cutting with cold chisels. Clearing is also going, on at the site of the burned sawmill, large forces of men being employed at both places. Nanaimo, however, is not only to have a new pithead, on which \$100,000 will be expended, and a new sawmill which will cost a large sum, to say nothing of the other pithead which is already going up at Departure bay, but a new electric light works also.

Assessing the recent conflagrations at their true value as mere temporary set-backs, and retaining the faith they have always had in the future of Nanaimo, the Electric Light Company will proceed at once with the erection of the new power house and plant which are to supersede the present structure and machinery on Fraser street. Hithertother to the company has used coal in order to obtain its power, driving the big dynamos by menns of a steam engine. In the dark days of last fall and winter, however, the murkiest succession ever experienced in this country, the fuel bill soared away up until it reached nearly four figures for the calendar month. Meanwhile over in Vancouver the electric light people were turning the water into their turbines from Lake Beautiful and getting on without any fuel bill at all, and the same time a quarter of a mile from the local works the Millstone river was roaring down it falls without turning a wheel of any kind. It is true that the river does not roar much in the dry months, but there is very little doing in the light business at that time anyway and a few tons of coal would meet the deficiency of water power. Pondering on these things, Mr. Joseph Hunter, the head of the company, decided that the stream should be made of service and that a new plant should be erected below the falls, the water, which has a fall of 167 feet in little over a mile, being diverted into turbines by which the dynamos could be driven most of the year.
