A NEW DANGER—POISONOUS FOODS

Within a few days seventy seven inmates of a poor-house in Berlin have been fatally poisoned by eating rotten fish that had been smoked to disguise its disgusting nature. Now comes a despatch from Coburg, Ont., to the effect that five boxes of sausages had been seized by the health officer of the town for being in a disgusting state of decomposition and therefore not only unfit for human food, but positively dangerous to health. It was further ascertained that these sausages had been forwarded by a packing-house in Toronto to an agent in Coburg to be fixed over and made palatable by the addition of spices. The discovery has created so great a sensation that the authorities will be forced to hunt down all concerned, and, if the facts are proven as stated, the law will allow severely as the law will allow. But clearly that is not severely enough to fit so dastardly a crime, for it is little short of murder to knowingly put on the market poisonous food as fit for human consumption. Poisonous food which is the result of the decomposition of meat or flesh of any kind, is just as deadly as arsenic, though its effect is slower, and too many precautions cannot be taken to guard against it, while the man who for the sake of miserable gain seeks to impose it upon his fellow being, should be treated as an enemy to society.

But the question arises, how long has this criminal business of fixing and spicing such stuff been going on, and how much of it from time to time gets into general circulation, or it is not to be supposed for an instant that its sale is intended for the small Coburg market. Nothing but the most rigid inspection of each package, both at the place of manufacture and sale, no mere sampling, can guard the public against danger in this connection.

CONVICTED FOR POACHING

There was a case of poaching tried before Police Magistrate Matheson last week. Six men, three of the McNaughton boys of Dee Side, George Delany, John Fitzgerald and Sandy Fraser of Matapedia, were convicted, and fined \$25.00 each and costs.

The poaching occurred during the early part of the season, on the Restigouche River, when accused threw their net out between two

scows, and we understand that only one small salmon was taken. This punishment makes it very expensive for poachers, and we are informed that the case was worked up by Mr. Max M. Mowat Head Guardian of the Restigouche Riparian Association and that at the time the offense was committed there were no Guardians near at hand which demonstrates the fact that the system now in vogue for guarding the rivers, is almost perfect, and that it is almost impossible for poachers to escape. This should be a warning to the people living along the rivers for in killing salmon, they are to mix our metaphors, only killing the goose that lays the golden egg.

If it were not for the wealthy Anglers who come to our rivers each year there would be a great deal less money in circulation.
