## WIFE OF MINISTER SUES FOR A DIVORCE

### Rev. Ednor Cooke May Marry Girl With Whom He Lived Six Years.

New York, April 23.—What looks like the closing act in a scandal which attracted much attention some six years ago, has now begun for Mrs. Cooke, in Connecticut, has entered proceedings for absolute divorce against her husband, Rev. Ednor Cooke. He was rector of St. George's Episcopal Church in New York, and his wife was a woman of exemplary life and possessed considerable wealth in her own right. They became estranged having no children. Eventually, Rev. Mr. Cooke found his affinity in his pretty little 17 year-old ward, Floretta Whaley, and the city was startled by the news that they had eloped.

They fled to Los Angeles, then to San Francisco and other points in the West. At times they were almost starving, and the clergyman was reduced to digging telegraph post holes. Pursued by the investigation of enquiring newspapers, their identity would be discovered and they would be driven forth as outcasts. Finally they returned to New York and he got a job as a painter and paper hanger. Interest in the affairs died out, and they have lately lived in obscurity and peace, in a humble home with their two little children.

Mrs. Cooke, at the time of the elopement in 1907, went to live with her parents in Connecticut. Her father and mother are now dead, and in case of her death part of her estate would go to the recreant husband, so she has at last entered suit for divorce. The proceedings are welcomed by the runaways with tears of joy and prayers of thanksgiving. Mrs. Cooke says that she has taken the proceedings so that Cooke can marry his ward and make his children legitimate.

## GERMAN MONEY MEN HERE NEXT AUGUST

### Visit Will Mean Much in Matters of International Industrial Expansion

### ITINERARY RECEIVED

A large group of influential business men of Germany will spend seven weeks in Canada during the latter part of June and the months of July and August. They will visit St. John, Moncton, Fredericton and other points in New Brunswick, arriving in this province about the middle of August.

The Times has received from the illustrated Zeitung of Leipzig the complete itinerary of the party, which will leave Bremen on June 24, arrive in Montreal on July 6, make a tour of Western Canada, return and arrive in St. John on August 16, concluding with a banquet in Fredericton on August 22 and departing from Rimouski the next day. The itinerary after August 15 will be as follows:—

Aug. 15—Afternoon: Departure from Montreal for the eastern provinces (New Brunswick, Nova Scotia).

Aug. 16—Day of rest, chance for sport (fishing, hunting).

Aug. 17-22—Tour through the eastern provinces, sight-seeing in Halifax, St. John, Fredericton and other noteworthy towns and inspection of their industries. The programme for the different towns is being arranged with the municipalities and governments and will be announced later.

Aug. 22—Fredericton, concluding banquet.

Aug. 23—Departure for Rimouski for those sailing for Europe on the "Empress of Ireland" of C. P. R. on August 24.

This tour of Canada follows as a result of a visit made last year by Court Councillor Horst Wober of the Illustrirte Zeitung. Wherever he went he was greatly impressed with the country, and on his return to Germany he published a report of all he had seen and experienced during a three month's tour. A special edition of his famous journal devoted to Canada will be issued very soon, and will be followed by this business men's trip to Canada by leading German personages of every field of activity.

The business men's trip is a unique enterprise, for it is the first time that such a party of representative Germans will visit this country and be officially received by the governments of the provinces and municipal authorities. It certainly speaks well for the "Illustrirte Zeitung" that immediately upon the suggestion of the trip an honorary committee was formed in Germany to promote the idea. From the list of personages and associations that are giving their support it is clear that the affair will be of high international importance.

Calgary, April 23.—It is reported here that R. B. Bennett, Conservative leader in that province is slated to succeed Dr. Roche as minister of the interior in the Borden government in the event of Roche's continued ill health compelling his retirement. Mr. Bennett is a New Brunswicker.

### Now His Favorite Young Kins-Woman, Divorced, Wants to Marry a Lieutenant

Vienna, April 23.—Austrians are preparing for another morganatic marriage romance in the imperial house of Hapsburg.

It will be recalled that recently Archduchess Isabella secured a divorce in Munich from Prince George of Bavaria on the ground that her husband was "hopelessly repulsive" to her. Now it is persistently asserted that the young Archduchess fell in love with a young Hungarian officer of Hussars about a month before her marriage in February of last year. Although she could not stop the wedding ceremony, she determined to leave her husband immediately afterward. She left him within three days.

Now she is being kept from seeing her lover and the result is her complete nervous breakdown. Old Emperor Francis Joseph, who has given way so often to Cupid, is adamant at the moment, but any day may relent for the sake of his favorite among his younger kinswomen.



Warm weather is helping out the lumber situation on the drives considerably, but rain is badly needed. Conditions are very poor on some of the small streams.


