**CANADA LAID FIRST CABLE.**

Earliest Messages Were Exchanged

Sixty-one Years Ago.

The first message to cross the

Atlantic by cable was exchanged

August 16, 1858. The first submarine

cable on this side of the Atlantic was

laid between New Brunswick and

Prince Edward Island, a distance of

ten miles, by the Governments of the

two provinces in 1857. The second

cable in America was also laid by

Canadian enterprise between Cape

Breton and Newfoundland, a distance

of 85 miles, in 1858.

The idea of laying a cable across

the Atlantic originated with Cyrus

Field, who organized the company

that was ultimately successful in

the enterprise, but with Frederick

Newton Gisborne, an Englishman

who came to Canada in 1847,

spent the last two years of his

life in the service of the

company, and it was his

brother, Hartley, on a farm near St.

John's, who first conceived the

idea of laying a cable across the

Atlantic. He was assisted in this

work by his brother, Frederick

Gisborne, who was then in the

service of the company.

Some years later Hartley

Gisborne went to Egypt, where he

became director of the state telegraph

service. He was then associated with

the organization of the British North

American Electric Telegraph Assn.
