THE TIME LIMIT APPLIES.

On This Grand the Conspirator Charge is Dismissed.

The charges of conspiracy preferred by Crown Attorney Curran against Alanson C. Winton and Samuel Wicks were dismissed by the Police Magistrate yesterday.

On the technical objection that over two years had elapsed between the commission of the alleged offense and the laying of the charge, Mr. Lindsey asked for a discharge of his clients.

In reply, the magistrate said that the Crown had not brought the case home very clearly, and without finally deciding on the point raised, he would dismiss the case against both defendants.

He believed, however, that there was a specific act of bribery as regards Wicks, and that owing to the two years' limit it was not punishable.

GENERAL BOUVER'S VISIT. Toronto Ministers Will Confer. "The Imported Muck of London."

At the meeting of the Ministerial Association yesterday, Rev. Mrs. Sims, Thomas, Parker, German and others, appointed a committee to confer with Commandant Young as to a reception proposed to be given to General Bouver on his visit to Toronto next month.

Reve, Burns, Kennedy and Hunter were appointed a committee to confer with the Prisoners' Aid Association, with a view to legislation for a better classification of prisoners.

Dr. Milligan, Thomas and Potter will frame a resolution recognizing the heroism of the Toronto Fire Brigade.

In the course of a missionary discussion, Dr. Milligan said: "do not believe in importing people from the muck of Glasgow and London; let us bring good blood into our country. If I go in for protection in anything, it would be in guarding the character of the people coming to this country."

SIX SHIPS MISSING. No Trace of the Lost Gunboats Can Be Found.

Washington, Jan. 7.—Captain Carter of the revenue cutter Grant reports to the Treasury Department that he has made a thorough search of the coast south as the Columbia River, along the Pacific Coast, from Port Townsend, without seeing any signs of wreckage or hearing any tidings from passing ships or from shore of the six gunboats which started south from Victoria, B.C., several weeks ago.

Identified After Fifteen Months. Battle Creek, Mich., Jan. 7.—Mrs. John Greenwood and her brother, Mark Clayton of Essex, England, have fully identified the body known as "No. 6," one of the victims of the Grand Trunk wreck here, Oct. 20, 1889, as John Greenwood, and the body was to-day shipped to Essex. The railway company has paid Mrs. Greenwood \$7500 for the loss of her husband.

Freight Collision at Massillon. Massillon, Ohio, Jan. 7.—A freight wreck took place this morning between Massillon and Orrville, in the Wheeling and Lake Erie Railroad. Brakeman Wells and Fireman Ryan were badly injured. It was a head-on collision and dozens of cars are piled up.

Admiral Loring Dead. London, Jan. 7.—Sir William Loring, K.C.B., Admiral of the Fleet, died at Ryde, Isle of Wight, on Friday, aged 82 years.

British Trade Returns. London, Jan. 7.—The Board of Trade returns for the month of December, 1894, show that during the month the imports decreased £3,680,000, and the exports increased £230,000, as compared with those for the corresponding month of the preceding year.


