would excuse the wretchedness of their rhyming capacities, while their meriands combined with the excellent binding of the volume would make a comparatively sa'e financial speculation. Of course he used many of old advertising catches such as patriotism, national life, federation, and the materials combined are in effect a lilliputian tower of Bai He arrogates to himself a kind of Divine right as to what is, and what not poetry; but nothing further is needed to prove the fallacy of his jument than the compilation that he made.

It may be claimed that some of the authors mentioned are unjustreated, but if they had placed much value on their reputation they shot have shunned such evil company.

Meantime if any author satisfactorily proves a forced presence Lighthall's volume we will omit him in the next edition in which a we will make addition of those diciples of folly who may conside themselves unjustly omitted in this.
