Diplomas and Honorable Mentions are offered for exhibits in the several departments of plalately, as publications, collections of postage, tilegraph and fiscal stamps, etc., essays, etc., etc. The committee insures against fire, etc., all articles sent, and guarantees to return them to their respective owners promptly after the exhibitten closes
