PRINCIPAL WOODS, of London College Institute, officiated at the Presbyterian church last Sunday, morning and evening, and preached able and interesting discourses. The resident pastor was absent at Stratroy.—Petrolia Topic.

SAYS THE Fergus Advocate: "Rev. Mr. Aull, of Palmerston, preached twice last Sabbath in St. Andrew's church, Fergus, to large audiences. The sermon on each occasion was excellent, and the congregations were delighted with the discourses from their old friend."

REV. DR. FRAZER, of Hamilton, preached the anniversary sermon of College street church, city, on the 17th inst., to large audiences. The pastor, Rev. A. Gilray, and people were cordially congratulated on the splendid work they have accomplished in the West End.

At a public meeting held at Barrie, in connection with North Simcoe Teachers' Association, Rev. Dr. Fraser presided. In opening the meeting Dr. Fraser contrasted the country and its schools fifty years ago with what they are at the present time. He advocated religious instruction in the schools.

THE anniversary services of the reopening of the Presbyterian church in Napawee will be held on Sabbath, the 15th of December next. The Rev. Principal Grant, D.D., Moderator of the General Assembly, will preach both morning and evening on that day. On the evening of Monday following a social meeting will be held.

At Clover Hill, on Tuesday, the 19th inst., the Rev. Mr. Hewitt was inducted into the pastoral charge of First Esna, Burns and Dunn's churches, Barrie Presbytery. Rev. J. Cochran presided. Rev. F. Smith, of Bradford, preached the sermon; Rev. J. Lelshman, of Angus, addressed the minister, the Rev. J. Carswell addressed the congregation. Although a very rainy day there was a fair congregation to welcome the new minister.

REV. J. L. SIMPSON was inducted, on the 5th inst., into the pastoral charge of Fort William, Presbytery of Winnipeg. Rev. John Pringle, Moderator, presided; Rev. W. Neilly preached. The Moderator addressed the newly-inducted pastor, and Rev. Robt. Nairn, of Rat Portage, and the people. After service in the church a welcome social was held at the residence of Mr. Armstrong. The unanimity of the call and the hearty welcome bestowed upon Mr. Simpson augur well for his success in his new field.

A PRESBYTERIAL conference will be held in connection with the next meeting of Toronto Presbytery on Tuesday, Dec. 3rd. The conference will begin at 9 p.m., in the lecture room of St. Andrew's church, King street west. The afternoon topic will be: "Faith, its Nature and its Results," the discussion of which will be led by the Rev. R. P. McKay, M.A., of Parkdale. The evening meeting will be held in Erskine church. The topic "Prayer Meetings" will be introduced by Rev. Wm. Patterson, of Cooke's church. This meeting will begin at 9 p.m., and close at 9 45 p.m. The public and especially all Christian workers are cordially invited.

THE congregation of Second church, Huntingdon, on Tuesday evening, Nov. 22th, in a social gathering commemorated the 35th anniversary of the induction of their pastor, Rev. James Watson, D.D. There was a large gathering present, including many from a distance. Andrew Somerville, Esq., ruling elder, occupied the chair, and in his address, after referring to the rarity in Canada of so long a pastorate in one church as that which were signaling, went on to pass a high eulogium upon Dr. Watson as a man, as a pastor, and as a preacher. A number of congratulatory letters having been read, Dr. Watson gave a most interesting address, recounting the story of his life and the history of the congregation. Addresses suitable to the occasion were delivered by Mr. Flynn, divinity student; Rev. A. Rowat, Rev. H. Gomery, and Rev. J. B. Muir. On the following Sabbath the anniversary sermons were preached by Rev. Principal MacVicar.

MEETING OF PRESBYTERY. HURON.

Met in Clinton on the 12th November. The remit on the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund being taken up, it was agreed to recommend "that it be not made obligatory on pastors and on foreign missionaries at their induction to connect themselves with the Fund." The proposal to appoint a General Secretary for Sabbath schools was disapproved of. On the report of the deputation appointed to visit a part of the field with regard to a better arrangement of it, the Presbytery agreed to make no change in the meantime. The congregations of Egmondville and Bayfield were allowed to furnish their own supply till next meeting of Presbytery. The estimated expenditure for the year was submitted, showing that a rate of fourteen cents per family would realize the sum required, and it was agreed to raise the amount accordingly. Mr. Martin was requested to continue to supply Chisholm. A circular from Dr. Reid was read, specifying the amount expected from this Presbytery for Assembly Fund. The attention of the brethren was called to it.—A. McLEAM, Clerk.

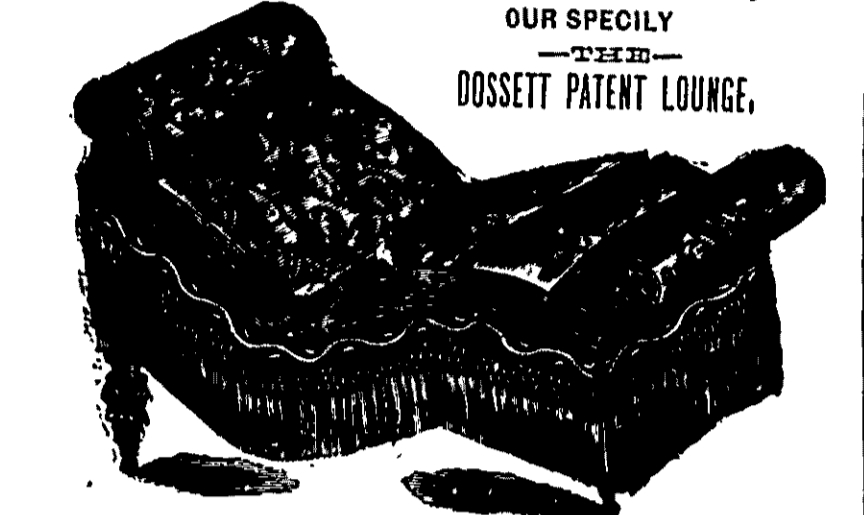
