59. The Government of Ghana agrees to pay allowances to members under the same regulations and under the same rates as are applicable to Ghanaian military personnel in respect of vehicle maintenance, travelling, motor mileage and related expenditures.

60. The Government of Ghana agrees to pay an entertainment allowance at the rates, and under the conditions, applicable in the Armed Forces of Ghana.

61. The Government of Ghana agrees to pay a disturbance allowance on commencement of residential service in Ghana to married members during their residential service provided that the family of the member resides in Ghana for at least six months. The rate of disturbance allowance is set out in Shedule B.

## Article XXI (Special Termination Credit)

62. The Government of Ghana agrees to make to every member a special payment called a special termination credit, in Canadian dollars at the rate of exchange in effect at the time, and at the end of each period of his residential service. The monthly rate of the special termination credit is set out in Schedule C.

63. The Government of Ghana agrees that the special termination credit will not attract taxation under the laws of Ghana.

64. Calculations for purposes of the credit payable under paragraph 62 will be based on the rank of the member and the period during which the rank is held.

## Article XXII (Issue of Emoluments)

65. With effect from the date of arrival in Ghana of a member until completion of his residential service, the Government of Ghana agrees that all emoluments payable by the Government of Ghana will be paid under arrangements to be made by the Pay Office of the Armed Forces of Ghana. The special termination credit payable under Article XXI will be paid by the Pay Office of the Armed Forces of Ghana.

## Article XXIII (Uniform Grant)

66. The Government of Ghana agrees to pay a uniform grant as set out in Schedule D to each member on commencement of residential service.

## Article XXIV (Passage Entitlement)

- 67. For the purposes of this Article,
  - (a) the family of a member is defined as his wife and children normally resident in his household; and
  - (b) a child must be under the age of eighteen years on the date of arrival in Ghana or have reached that age during the member's residential service.

68. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide:

- (a) return transportation for members and their families between Montreal or other port of embarkation in North America and the station in Ghana at the beginning and end of residential service;
- (b) return transportation for all members and their families on midtour leave between their station in Ghana and Montreal;
- (c) return transportation for any member granted compassionate leave under Article XVII of this Agreement;
