
ANTI-PERSONNEL LANDMINES

Awareness Of International Treaty Initiative

Two fifths (39%) of Canadians are aware of a Canadian initiative to negotiate and sign an international treaty that would ban anti-personnel landmines all over the world by the end of this year.

Some segments of the Canadian population are more likely than others to have heard of this country's initiative. The groups most likely to be aware of the initiative are British Columbians (47%), residents of Saskatchewan or Manitoba (45%), Canadians over the age of 55 (56%), men (49%), university graduates (53%) and more affluent Canadians (43%).

Least likely to have heard of the landmine initiative are Quebecers (70%), Canadians aged 18 to 34 (72%), women (69%), and those without a high school diploma (67%).
