PRAYERS.

Mr. Mackenzie (Vancouver Centre), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Order in Council passed under the provisions of the Relief Act, 1935, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 416, dated February 20, 1936: accepting tender of Messrs. J. A. and M. Cote, Limited, St. Hyacinthe, P.Q., for 11,500 pairs of boots, ankle, required for issue to men in relief camps operated by the Department of National Defence, at \$3.127 per pair, sales tax and delivery at Ottawa included.

On motion of Mr. Lapointe (Quebec East) for Mr. Mackenzie King, it was ordered,—That the report of the Secretary of State for External Affairs for the year ended December 31st, 1935, be referred to the Standing Committee on Industrial and International Relations.

Mr. Rogers, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, in accordance with the provisions of Article 406 of the Treaty of Versailles, and the corresponding provisions of the other Treaties of Peace:—

Authentic texts of the Draft Conventions and Recommendations adopted at the Seventeenth (1933) and Eighteenth (1934) Sessions of the International Labour Conference, Geneva.

And also,—Texts of two Orders in Council, P.C. 1564, dated July 12, 1935, and P.C. 1565, dated July 12, 1935, dealing with the competence of Parliament and of the Provincial Legislatures respectively with regard to the subject-matters of these draft conventions and recommendations.

Mr. Pouliot, seconded by Sir Eugene Fiset, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 6, An Act to repeal The Economic Council of Canada Act, 1935, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
