PRAYERS.

Mr. Garson, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police for the year ended March 31, 1953. (English and French).

Mr. Garson also laid before the House,—Report on the Administration of Part V, Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act, for the year ended March 31, 1953, in respect of pensions, contributions, gratuities, retiring allowances, etc., pursuant to Section 108, Chapter 241, R.S.C. 1952.

Also,—Report of the Restrictive Trade Practices Commission, dated May 28, 1953, concerning alleged price discrimination between retail hardware dealers in North Bay, Ontario.

And also,—Report of the Restrictive Trade Practices Commission, dated May 1, 1953, concerning alleged instances of resale price maintenance of soap products in the Montreal District. (English and French).
