

Informs the Minister and others of the government that the implementation of this pernicious doctrine by obstruction, threat, intimidation, molestation, offer of advantage, other corrupt practice, or at all, is a crime against the law and custom of Parliament;

Affirms that it is the undoubted right and ancient privilege of this House that all witnesses to attend before this House or before any committee of this House have and enjoy the privilege of this House in coming, staying and returning; and

Declares that it is a breach of the privilege of this House to tamper with a witness in regard to his evidence to be given before this House or before any committee of this House, or endeavour, directly or indirectly, to deter or hinder any person from appearing or giving evidence, or attempt by persuasion, solicitation or advice of any kind to induce a witness not to attend or to withhold evidence or to give false evidence, or otherwise interfere with his freedom to form and express his own opinions honestly in the light of all the facts known to him.—(*Notice of Motion No. 38*).
