- 1. Are any employees of the Canadian government printing bureau engaged in the private printing business and, if so, who are they and under what firm is such business being operated in each instance?
- 2. Was any investigation conducted to establish whether any printing bureau equipment is being used, or has been used, in connection with the con[Mr. Mather.]

duct of such private businesses and, if so (a) what were the results of such investigation (b) in what business or businesses is or was such equipment used and under what authority?

- 3. Have any of the employees of the printing bureau been engaged in performing private printing services for themselves or others, using printing bureau equipment and materials on printing bureau time and, if so, what are the names of such employees and their supervisors?
- 4. What such services were so printed and on whose authority?

Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry):

1. Twelve employees of the Canadian government printing bureau are members of a small investment syndicate (which has a total of 21 members), to which each member makes monthly contributions. Syndicate funds are invested in second mortgages, stocks, and real estate, and include a three fifths (\(\frac{5}{5}\)) interest in a commercial printing firm, Imprimerie Gasparo Ltée, Hull, Quebec. Three of the employees serve as directors of the company, but otherwise none is actively engaged in the operations of the firm. The names of the
