Dear Sir:-

The Lyman Bequest Committee, at a meeting held on April 18th, at which the following were present: Dr. A. Willey, Chairman, Mr. A. Gibson, Dominion Entomologist, Prof. W.H. Brittain of MacDonal College, A.F. Winn, Curator, and George A. Moore, Secretary, it was considered advisable to call your attention to the fact that the room at the Museum, for which a rental of \$500., annually is paid to the University out of the Lyman Bequest, is rapidly becoming inadequate to house the Collections and Library. This collection is widely used for research by visiting Entomologists and is an asset to McGill University. We would, therefore, invite a consideration of additional space and would express the wish that the rental of the room might be reduced to a nominal figure.

It is proposed to make a feature exhibition on the ground floor of the Redpath Museum during Convocation week which is likely to attract many visitors.
