CONDUCT of the FRENCH

IN

NORTH-AMERICA.

THE late and present Conduct of the
 T *French in North-America*, is now very
 justly become the Object of Attention
 of the *British* Nation. They are sensible that their
 unjustifiable Encroachments must be attended
 with bad Consequences to the *British* Colonies
 there; and that in the event *Great-Britain* itself
 must be greatly affected. But the sense of these
 Things is, however, so general and indetermi-
 nate, that it may not be amiss at this Juncture,
 plainly and particularly to shew the Import-
 ance of the *British* Colonies in *North-America*
 to the Mother Kingdom; and the necessary
 fatal Consequences of the present Measures the
French are pursuing, unless a speedy and final
 Stop be put to them.
