

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

REPORT ON LIGHTING SYSTEM SATISFACTORY
Hamilton Will Have Up-to-date Plant—Will Be Paid For in Thirty Years.

HAMILTON, June 7.—(Special.)—E. J. Sifton, consulting engineer, to-night read and explained his report on the proposed municipal power and lighting plant to the members of the city council at an informal meeting in the mayor's office.

Hamilton will have up-to-date plant—will be paid for in thirty years. The report includes plans for the supply of power to the city and to commercial users and a system of street and residence lighting covering the entire city as at present laid out, and also provides for a 2-1/2 per cent increase in the street area of the city.

Opposition From Cataract. The first gun was fired to-day in the campaign over the municipal power and light bylaw, when W. C. Hawkins, general manager of the Dominion Power and Transmission Co., issued a statement to the effect that his company intended to spend several thousand dollars in extending its plant in Hamilton, and in doing so would be interfering with the bylaw which is voted on.

Refused to Pay Law Costs. The financial committee of the council this afternoon refused to pay the law costs of the defence of J. Walter Gage in the mandamus proceedings of Bolton v. Warden, which was argued in the celebrated case in which the plaintiff applied for an order to compel the councillors to fall for failure to proceed with the construction of the House of Refuge. Mr. Gage was defended by a lawyer of his own choice and not by the county's solicitor. The finance committee also refused to pay the costs of the defence of J. Walter Gage.

Returned to Work. But—The city garbage collectors, whose demands for an increase in wages were refused by the works committee last night, went on strike this morning. They were persuaded to return to work, however, and give the city a week's notice of their intention to quit if their wages are not raised. They are getting \$2 a day and want \$2.25. It is likely that the men who are causing the trouble will be discharged.
