

### WELL WATER FOR TORONTO

Joseph Harvey, Greenville, Will Sink Test Wells at the Island as an Experiment.

Mayor Geary issued a statement yesterday to the effect that Joseph Harvey of Greenville, well specialist, had been engaged by the city to undertake the work of sinking test wells in Toronto Island, to ascertain the advisability of establishing a well system of water supply for the city. The city has decided to apply to the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board for an order compelling the Toronto and Suburban Railway Company to put their tracks on Davenport-road in shape immediately.

### UNIONISTS HOLD E. NOTTINGHAM

First Election in Britain With Home Rule as Direct Issue — Majority Slightly Reduced.

LONDON, April 19.—(C.A.P.)—East Nottingham by-election, caused by the retirement thru ill-health of Major Morrison, resulted in a Unionist majority of 1304, the figures being: Sir John Rees, 6462; T. W. Dobson (Liberal), 5152. This was the first by-election in which home rule made the leading issue.

In the previous general election the vote was: Morrison (U.), 6374; D. Stewart Smith (L.), 4804; Unionist majority, 1470.
