CANADIAN BANK STATEMENT.

The statement of the chartered banks of Canada at the end of October is at hand. It shows an increased trade, and is regarded as satisfactory. The feature of special importance is the increase in note circulation. The notes out on Oct. 31 amounted to \$35,955,000, an increase of over \$3,300,000 during the month, while the total a year ago was only \$34,671,000. The increase in the volume of business is reflected by the increase in the discounts of the banks, the total on Oct. 31, being \$214,159,000, as against \$209,959,000 on Sept. 30 and \$201,755,000 on Oct. 31, 1895. Against this large increase is the increase in cash held by banks. Specie amounts to \$8,844,000, as against \$7,407,000 a year ago, but there is a decrease in Dominion notes. Call loans, \$13,948,000, as against \$13,577,000 in September and \$17,197,000 a year ago. The balances due on banks in the United States are \$15,880,000, as against \$16,045,000 on Sept. 30 and \$2,698,000 a year ago. The deposits of the banks increased \$5,500,000 during the month, and the total is \$192, 1830,000, as against \$186,080,000 a year ago.
