INDICTED FOR MURDER. Nurse Who Shot Doctor Creates a

Scene in Court. NEW YORK, June 16 .- Sarah Koten, the nurse who shot and killed Dr. Martin W. Auspitz on June 7, has been indicted by the grand jury on a charge of murder in the first degree.
