SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for must appear in person at the Do-minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain condi-tious, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homestead-

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nipe miles of his homestead on a farm of Duties -- Six months' residence at least 30 acres solely owned and occu-pled by him or by his father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in
