The Toronto World LLOYD GEORGE URGES RESUMPTION OF TRADE WITH RUSSIA U.S. "Dry" Law Is Constitutional Hard Battle Will Determine Decision of the Supreme Court Choice of Republican Party

LLOYD GEORGE ARGUES STRONGLY IN FAVOR OF OPENING UP TRADE WITH SOVIET DESPITE CRUELTY

Says It is New Doctrine That Customs Must Be Approved Before Trading—Appeals to House Not to Seek Quarrels—Cannot Crush Bolshevism—Cabinet Confers With Russian Envoy.

London, June 7.—Premier Lloyd George, Earl Curzon, the foreign minister, and Andrew Bonar Law, government leader in the house of commons, conferred today with Gregory Krassin, Russian soviet minister of trade and commerce, at the premier's official residence, 10 Downing street.

The conference was also attended by Winston Spencer Churchill, the war minister, Sir Eric Geddes, minister of transportation, Arthur J. Balfour, lord president of the council, Walter Hume Long, first lord of the admiralty, and Austen Chamberlain, chancellor of the exchequer.

Mr. Lloyd George provoked a hearty round of laughter by remarking: "This country has opened up most of the cannibal trade in the world."

Unbowed and largely unorganized, the delegates are asking one another in what direction they are straying, and when a Moses will arise to lead them out of the wilderness of their own indecision.

PROHIBITION AND ENFORCEMENT UPHELD BY U. S. SUPREME COURT; EIGHTEENTH AMENDMENT VALID

North America To Be Bone Dry

This decision of the supreme court of the United States is of a most far-reaching character. There was a constitutional amendment as to slavery; it established liberty for the slave.

Many attempts were made to modify the law by acts of state legislatures allowing a mild or modified beer to be brewed and sold, while other states attempted to pass laws which enjoined federal officers from enforcing prohibition.

Where the act is especially far-reaching is in the fact that it has stopped the manufacture of whiskey, and that any stock which remained in the possession of the distillers in the United States before the law was passed had to be exported early this year.

This decision of the United States supreme court will also have a far-reaching effect in Canada. It will make Ontario and all the other provinces outside of Quebec bone dry.
