# FALL WHEAT HAS WINTERED WELL

Loss Not More Than Four Per Cent., Despite Severity of Weather.

Ottawa, May 15.—The first crop report of the season of 1920 was issued today by the Dominion bureau of statistics. It deals with the winter killing of fall wheat and of hay and clover meadows and the progress of spring seeding, the report being compiled from the returns of crop correspondents from all parts of Canada for April. Notwithstanding the severity of the past winter, the proportion of fall sown wheat that has been killed is reported to be very small, amounting, in fact, to not more than four per cent. of the area sown. This is the smallest proportion on record, and compared with five per cent. last year, after an extraordinary mild winter with 52 per cent. in 1917-18.

The small proportion this year is due to the fact that the winter snow and late spring, as usually fall sown wheat in Canada is damaged more by alternating frosts and thaws during March and April than by cold in the depths of the winter, when the ground is covered with snow.

Deducting the areas reported as winter killed, representing four per cent., or 28,700 acres in Ontario, one per cent. or 400 acres in Alberta, and four per cent. or 400 acres in British Columbia, the total reduction by winter killing is 29,500 acres, leaving 740,800 acres as the area of fall wheat to be harvested in 1920, as compared with 772,700 acres the finally estimated harvest area for 1919.

The average condition of fall wheat on April 30 last was 58, representing the promise of a yield two per cent. below the average of the ten years 1910-19. Last year at the same date was 55, or 15 per cent. below the average of the previous ten years. The condition of April 30 is reported as 55 per cent. or 11 per cent. below the average of the ten years 1910-19. By provinces, the condition was as follows: Prince Edward Island, 50; Nova Scotia, 50; New Brunswick, 51; Quebec, 58; Ontario, 52; Manitoba, 53; Saskatchewan, 58; Alberta, 58, and British Columbia 56.

About five per cent. of the area under hay and clover is reported as winter killed. It compares with six per cent. last year and 11 per cent. in 1918. The condition of hay and clover meadows on April 30 is reported as 55 per cent. or 11 per cent. below the average of the ten years 1910-19. By provinces, the condition was as follows: Prince Edward Island, 50; Nova Scotia, 50; New Brunswick, 51; Quebec, 58; Ontario, 52; Manitoba, 53; Saskatchewan, 58; Alberta, 58, and British Columbia 56.

**GOIN PREDICTS BOOM IN CANADA RESOURCES**

London, May 15.—Sir Lomer Goin, premier of Quebec, called on the Minnesota on Saturday. He said that on no previous visit had he realized so fully the breadth of vision of British statesmen and of the business community. He had good reason to anticipate, as a result of the visit, that immediate steps would be taken to develop some of Canada's great natural resources. The premier said: "We have, I believe, on the eve of a great boom in the world's market, more manufactured goods, and we have an inexhaustible raw material supply. We want work for the British capital."

The agent-general's office in London, he added, was proving increasingly valuable, and the Quebec government would extend its usefulness.

**GLENN OF WATERWAYS COMMISSION, STRICKEN**

Winnipeg, Man., May 15.—Former Governor R. B. Glenn, of North Dakota, a member of the International Joint Commission of Waterways, died of heart failure at a local hotel at eight o'clock. A trained nurse, who has been in constant attendance on Glenn since last year, was the only person with him when he died.

Over-exertion on the high commission's investigation of the St. Lawrence deep waterway project hastened his death.

**CUT WIRES TO STOP THE CARS**

quartermaster of a mile away to get word to the police.

Immediately it was known that there was trouble, arrangements were made with the police to send out taxicabs to take the passengers to the city in the taxi reaching the scene of the accident at 12:15 a.m.

Owing to the amount of wire down nothing could be done toward making repairs until daylight Sunday. But even when the repairs were made, there was still no power available and a system of control of the line became necessary.

The result of the wire found to have been cut in two places by the breaking of the messenger wire insulators between Yarmouth and St. Thomas a guy wire was found to have been cut and laid up on the rail so that it had become fused to it by the heat generated by short circuiting.

In answer to a question, Mr. Richards stated that, with little series of breaks in the line, it would be impossible to operate trains again before noon on Monday. No trains at all were operated on Sunday. At the present time the officials of the road state they have no suspicion as to who the guilty parties are.

From another source it was learned that plans had been made to form a case of conspiracy to obstruct the road, giving each man a mile stretch to cover, but this could not be confirmed.

**Denials by the Men.**

Conversations with representatives of the men brought in no information that the trouble had been caused by the men or their friends. "Some enemy both of the break in the wire was made on this," stated one of the strikers tonight, in answer to a question put by a reporter.

The events of Saturday night brought to mind that when it was sought to start the operation on Monday, Friday, following the walk-out of the men, a break in the wire was discovered between St. Thomas and St. John's.

Thursday at midnight, what was said to be a break in the wire was definitely located. It was "broken" wire had been cut. Operation of the wire in the two-mile stretch between St. Thomas and St. John's was resumed at noon on Friday and continued till the trouble on Saturday night.

**EGG MARKETS.**

Ottawa, May 15.—The situation in eastern Canada is practically unchanged. Prices to producers are tending to lower levels, and range from 43 to 48, with egg circles receiving 46 to 48, and track shippers 47 to 49 per doz. Storage packed eggs are moving at 55 to 56 per doz.
