Ladies and Gentlemen:—The year brought no change in our capital. There was not a single request for life membership for that account during the year; consequently we must face the problem of increased expenses without interest increase. The capital funds of the home total \$112,805.85. Other monies in the treasurer's hands aggregate \$9,068.88, making the total holdings in capital account, funeral expenses, life support, etc., \$121,874.73, an increase of \$1,824.08 in the year. Yearly report of the Ladies' Aid of the Home for Incubables: Ladies and Gentlemen:—During the past year the work of the Ladies' Aid has been carried on with care and earnest endeavor to assist the board of management in maintaining the comfort and efficiency of the home and promoting the welfare, spiritual and bodily, of those committed to the kindly protection of the home.

The services arranged for by our committee every Sunday afternoon, and the past year, whether owing to the unprecedented amount of patriotic work engaged in, or to other causes, the visiting has become somewhat desultory. This is to be regretted.

The usual number of small pleasures have been planned and carried out as follows: In June, July, August and September monthly treats of ice cream and cake were provided in October a feast of fruit cake, celery and other Thanksgiving fare. For the Christmas festival a generous supply of acceptable gifts adorned the large Christmas trees, together with fruit and sweets for all while abundant cheer and cheer greeted by Christmas and New Year's dinners. At Christmas time individual plants, fruit, candles and boxes of candy to brighten the daily round.
