

"In the medical profession," Dr. Henderson declared, the public had to recognize that a great many medicinal substances can be used only by experts. Yet many new remedies were being extensively advertised and even used in random fashion by the profession before they have been tested sufficiently to lay a firm foundation for their use. In consequence, enormous sums of money were wasted annually to the detriment of the country"s health."

Soviet Cavalry Officers Have Joined Chinese Nationalists

RUSSIA IS BACK OF

LONDON, June 25—The Daily Mail's Tokio correspondent says he has received authoritative advices from Mukden, Manchuria, that regular officers in Russian Cavalry units have arrived in China to assist Chinese Nationalists in their fight to regain power west of Pekin.

Russian war materials including artillery supplies are said to be reaching the Chinese Nationalist army daily from Dailoru. It is alleged that the Soviet has agreed to finance the projected Nationalist attempt to recapture Pekin to the extent of \$6,250,000.

It is stated that in Progressive caucus yesterday, enough members were against the Government to defeat it by their votes. If more than four withdraw their support the Government is defeated.


