RUSSIA IS BACK OF NEW PEKIN DRIVE, IS TOKIO REPORT

Soviet Cavalry Officers Have Joined Chinese Nationalists

LONDON, June 25—The Daily Mail's Tokyo correspondent

says he has received authoritative advice from Mukden, Manchuria, that regular officers in Russian Cavalry units have arrived in China to assist Chinese Nationalists in their fight to regain power west of Peking.

Russian war materials including artillery supplies are said to be reaching the Chinese Nationalist army daily from Dailou. It is alleged that the Soviet has agreed to return the projected Nationalist attempt to recapture Peking to the extent of \$625,000.

FIVE PROGRESSIVES CAN DEFEAT GOVT.

Speculations Rife at Ottawa as to Intentions of Farmer Group

OTTAWA, June 25—Members are lining themselves up for the coming vote. This will take place some time tonight. It is generally expected that the remaining 22 Progressives at least two, W. T. Lucas of Camrose, and A. M. Boutilier of Vegreville, are not expected to change their intention to vote with the Opposition.

It is stated that in Progressive caucus yesterday, enough members were against the Government to defeat it by their votes. If more than four withdrew their support the Government is defeated.

A count of known absentees, the House today comprises 100 Liberals (plus Mr. Speaker, who has only a de facto vote), 116 Conservatives, 22 Progressives, 2 Laborites and 2 Independents.
