BODY OF UNKNOWN SOLDIER TO REST IN WESTMINSTER

London, Oct. 20—The authorities have decided to bury the body of an unknown soldier in Westminster Abbey on the day of the unveiling of the permanent cenotaph in Whitehall, which is being built in memory of the nation's war

T. G. ROBERTS HEARD IN INTERESTING ADDRESS

Captain Theodore Goodridge Roberts a native son of New Brunswick, addressed the Canadian Club at Bond's last night. His address was straight-forward and in places humorous as he dealt with the varieties of military writings for the chronicling of the events of the great war. He said that while in Flanders he wrote an article on trench warfare and one on minor offensive operations. Upon arrival in England he found that the writings attributed to him were not recognizable by him as his own work, as they had been altered by a man who had been writing for the South African war and favored a florid style of writing. Fearing even more disastrous results if the work was changed, Captain Roberts asked that the book be left as it was, but disclaimed authorship of the writing in its present form. He dealt with war diaries and spoke of the influence of fiction writers on war writings. He also spoke of the accounts of the same action written by the O. C. of a battalion and the second in command, which often differed materially in fact. Regarding war poetry he said that with the exception of Canon Scott and Col. John McCrae he thought that there had been no before-the-war poets who wrote poetry during the war. ward and in places humorous as he






