agreement, which must be signed by the responsible party, because, as in the case above mentioned, and one other still with us, the persons placing them in the Home have failed to meet the payment. The Home is intended only for *respectable old women*, and such are generally members of churches, or have friends interested in them, to whom it is a great comfort to know, that for such a small sum they can, in their old age, have a comfortable home and the necessary attention and care.

As we mentioned in last year's 'report, we do not make any special collection for this department of our work, neither do we receive any City grant for it, therefore we are grateful to all those who, recognizing the needs, kindly add—when giving their subscription for the Industrial Refuge — something for the Aged Women's Home. These special gifts will all be found in the list of collections.

To be the means of helping the old and feeble, who are left without any one to attend to their needs, to a place where they will meet with quiet comfort and patient care, is surely one of those works which will bring to the helper the blessing of the Master.

Miss Lee still remains our faithful, kind and careful matron.
