#.371 Well, the squadron conducted an investigation into the
Work Tickets and it was found that many of the Work Tickets they are numbered consecutively from one to whatever number
they went to and it was found that some Tickets were missing.
There was no record of them and it was also found that the
Work Tickets which were supposed to have been kept were not
kept.

Q.372 And can you tell me up to what date?
A.372 Up to the Nineteenth of February. After the Nineteenth there was no record of Work Tickets whatsoever.

Def Offr: I will try to get a witness on the investigation of these
Work Tickets. I was supposed to see him before this trial
opened this afternoon but I didn't contact him. I will
endeavour to get somebody to tell us more about it.

In the opinion of the Court and Judge Advocate, it is not necessary to comply with the provisions of Rule of Procedure 83(B).

The witness stands down.

## SECOND WITNESS FOR THE DEFENCE:

Capt R.J. Fassina, RCAMC, att 2/7 Cdn Recce Regt CAOF, having been duly sworn, is examined by the Defending Officer:

Q.373 Would you give your name to the reporter?
A.373 Captain R.J. Fassina.

Q.374 And your unit? A.374 Attached to 2/7 Recce.

Q.375 For how long? A.375 Since the fifth of July 1945.

Q.376 Now Captain Fassina, do you know the Defendant, Captain Jessop?

A.376 Yes sir.

Q.377 Do you recognize him in Court? A.377 Yes sir. (Witness indicates the accused)

Q.378 Did he ever have occasion to consult you about his physical condition?

A.378 Yes.

Q.379 Since January the first? A.379 Yes sir.

Q.380 Can you give us any particular dates that you treated him

for anything from that time on?

A.380 On the Twenty-Fifth of February I returned from leave and I was told that Captain Jessop was ill. I didn't see him that day because the bridge was out but I saw him the following day.

Q.381 Have you any records that you keep to refresh your memory?
How do you remember?

A.381 May I consult my diary?

Q.382 Have you got your diary with you? 2.382 No. I have extracts with me.

Def Offr: May he look at his extracts from his diary? Have you got it right with you?

President: I don't think they are in order.

JA: When did you make these extracts? Witness: I just copied them right out.
