

# STOLEN JEWELLERY

Much of It Deposited in the New York Assay Office.

Stopped Sending Jewellery, While Others Melted It Down.

withdrawal from the New York Assay Office on Wednesday of a Central Office man, who had been put there to detect deposits of stolen gold it became known today that for the last six months systematic efforts have been made by the Police Department, under Commission Bingham, with the co-operation of the United States Government, to put an end to the turning in to the Assay Office here of stolen watches and other jewelry which had been taken in this city by thieves and pickpockets.
