LE "NATIONAL COUNCIL OF EDUCATION" A MONTREAL

L'entrepreneur Major Ney

C'est aujourd'hui, lundi de Pâques 5 avril, que s'ouvre à Montréal le troisième Congrès du "National Council of Education", qui, sous la conduite de l'entrepreneur Major Ney, de Winnipeg, arrivé au Canada venant d'Egypte il y a dix-huit ans, a réussi à mobiliser en quelques mois autour de son association nombre de personnages anglais, français et canadiens. Le très agissant major accompagnait tout récemment le maréchal Allenby à Québec, ayant pris la tournée canadienne de l'illustre soldat britannique sous son patronage, ou plutôt sous celui du "National Council of Education" dont le major est l'aménou, si vous aimez mieux comme il se fait appeler lui-même par les journalistes, le secrétaire exécutif. A un reporter du Chronicle-Telegraph qui l'interviewait à Québec le 27 mars au sujet du but de son Council, le major Ney répondit que le Conseil "cherche à jeter une nouvelle lumière sur le problème encore non résolu de l'éducation..." Or, n'en déplaise au Major Ney, l'Eglise catholique a résolu depuis longtemps le problème de l'éducation; et c'est même à cette solution que le monde doit d'être civilisé. Ceux de nos catholiques canadiens qui ont accepté l'invitation du Major Ney et de son Conseil n'ont donc certainement pas à Montréal, cette semaine, pour y chercher la solution du problème de l'éducation. Mais ils pourraient bien y trouver, en germe dans le Congrès, sinon ouvertement proposé, le projet favori du Major Ney, qui est l'établissement au Canada d'un Bureau d'Education fédéral pour uniformiser ("standardiser") l'enseignement canadien d'un océan à l'autre.

Les congressistes catholiques du "National Council of Education" auront bien soin, nous n'en doutons point, de ne pas tomber dans le panneau fédéral du Major Ney.—S. I. C.
