This attractive flying costume was designed by Miss Harriet Quimby, the first woman aviator in America. And she has it on herself in the picture. It consists of two garments, a blouse and knickerbockers. The material used is a plum-colored satin faced cloth. A monk hood is attached to the neat fitting blouse that is cut with long shoulders and closes under the arm. The knickerbockers are provided with a row of buttons on either of the inside seams, which when unfastened transforms the trousers into a short divided skirt. When not in her machine Miss Quimby covers her costume with a long coat. She says in reality there is no need of the short skirt arrangement.
