When the starting gun was fired for the Olympic Marathon, I knew I was in the race of my life, against the best distance runners in the world, and I realized my brains as well as my legs must be used to bring victory.

I started at an easy trot and maintained the pace for more than ten miles. Other runners were passing me constantly, but this didn't worry me; in fact I was glad, because experience had taught me that the man who has the speed and strength at the finish.

Around the 18th mile I bezan to go abit faster and just as I was finishing the 19th mile I bound Longboat had dropped out. I knew I had passed other runners, but it was not until I was in the twenties that my train
