The Danish barkentine Rise, under
command of Capt. Hasegensen, sailed
yesterday for Belfast with a cargo of
\$18,338 feet of spruce deals. A. Wat-

CARRIED CARGO OF LATHS.

The schooner Vineyard sailed yester-
day direct for New York with a cargo
of 1,000,000 spruce laths. Randolph &
Baker were the shippers.

Regarding Gannet Light.

Though the Yarmouth Press is mak-
ing a considerable agitation regard-
ing the matter of a light and fog sig-
nal on the Gannet Rock off the Yar-
mouth coast, nothing further has been
done about the matter by the federal
authorities. J. C. Chesley, agent for
the Marine and Fisheries department,
has sent the report of his engineers
and his recommendation to the Ot-
tawa office, but as yet has not re-
ceived any definite information regard-
ing the matter.

The Aberdeen Tenders.

The tenders for repairing and paint-
ing the D. G. S. Aberdeen closed yester-
day and it is expected that the con-
tract will be awarded to the succes-
ful bidder before the end of the week.

Schooner Due Today.

The schooner William Nottingham is
due at this port today from New York.
She will load deals for overseas.

Resumes European Services.

The White Star Line has announce
the resumption of its services between
New York, Cherbourg and Southampton,
which was abandoned after the
declaration of war. The first trip will
be made by the Adriatic next Thurs-
day, August 14.

Direct Service to France.

The Montreal-Havre passenger ser-
vice of the Cie Canadienne Transat-
lantique was started on Thursday last
when the S. S. California arrived from
Havre.

Record Ship Sale.

One hundred steamers, built on the
Great Lakes and on the St. Lawrence,
sold by the U. S. Shipping Board to
the Anderson Overseas Corporation for
approximately \$50,000,000. This is
probably the largest ship sale on re-
cord. The vessels will ultimately pass
over to Italian and French owners.

Returns From Long Voyage.

Capt. Frank Belliveau, with his crew,
who commanded the schooner Race-
wel, on her trip from St. John to South
Africa, and thence to Havre, France,
with a cargo of wool, which she sold
to the French government, arrived in
Yarmouth via New York and Boston
and proceeded to their homes at
Church Point, Digby county.

Undergoing Repairs.

The schooner Georgia D. Jenkins,
which grounded on Duck Island last
week while en route to New York from
this port, is in the Market Slip under-
going repairs.

Leaves For Gagetown.

The schooner Able C. Stubbs, which
is discharging a cargo of coal, will
leave for Gagetown today to load tim-
ber for New York.
