The Grand Lodge was called to labor at half-past 12 o'clock, M. W. Grand Master in the East.

## CORNER STONE LAID.

The Grand Lodge, escorted by the Royal Arch Chapter and a large number of Brethren from the different Subordinate Lodges, and several Visiting Brethren, headed by the Band of the 82nd Battalion, marched to the Market Square, where the different Societies were assembled to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. After an Address by the Lieutenant Governor, the different Societies started in procession, the Masonic being last, and marched through the principal streets, and then to the site of the Fublic Building, when a halt was made, and the different Societies opened out, facing inwards, and the Grand Master, supported by the Grand Officers, marched through to the site and ascended the platform raised at the northeast corner where the building is to be erected, the brethren forming a hollow square near the platform.

The M. W. Grand Master being seated, the W. Grand Marshall then made proclamation.
