old enough for sale, but we have a lot of fine
young things coming on. Our poultry never
looked better. Our Minorcas, of which we
have three pens, all headed by prize-winning
cocks and cockerels, are fine. In S. G. Dork-
ings, we have a fine lot of hens, mated with
one of the best cocks ever bred by Shore Bros.
Of W. Wyandottes we have a fine pen of large
birds of pure white plumage, free from any
brassy tinge. Of B. Rocks, we have 8 hens
all nicely barred, and mated with a cockerel
that took first prize wherever shown last fall."
**H. J. DAVIS, SHORTHORNS, BERKSHIRES AND
YORKSHIRES.**

At the home of Mr. H. J. Davis, Woodstock,
Ont., we found his herds in their usual vigor-
ous condition, the Shorthorns numbering a
dozen head, three of which are mated mat-
rcons of the Verbena and Arundel families,
both of which were purchased from Mr.
Arthur Johnston, Rosebud, by imported
Roan Prince 3733, and out of Violet's Melrose,
a nine-year-old red cow, four of her half
dozen calves being in the herd, all of which
are females, with one exception, a yearling bull
by Sirathalia Chief 1831, a nicely-marked,
roan, useful animal, well and evenly fleshed,
and held for sale. From the same sire we saw
a well-made two-year-old red heifer, which
has a grand back, and promises to develop
into a grand cow; also a young red-roan bull
calf of the thirty sort. Verbena's Gem, by
Roan Prince, and out of Verbena 12th 4916, is
a large red heifer, a yearling bull, a regular
producer; her two-year-old red, thick-
fleshed heifer, a sweet heifer calf and roan
bull calf at her feet, being in the herd.

We found this the home of some 30 regis-
tered Yorkshires and 20 Berkshires. The
Yorkshire matrons comprise such sows as
Oak Lodge Snowflake 2107, by Oak Lodge
Diamond 38, and out of imported Snowflake
371. She is now three years old, and has been
a regular breeder. Among her last litter
were three choice young boars, rising five
mos. She farrowed again in March. Nora J.
2007, by Paddy 813, and out of Nora 2176, is a
yearling sow from the pens of Mr. Joseph
Featherstone, Streetsville, and is now suck-
ling her first litter of 8. She is a typical sow
of the breed, with well-formed head, and
promises to become a valuable matron. A
pair of choice young sows are by Goldfinder,
and out of Mistress 4th 42 (bred by Walker
Jones, Mollington, England), one of which
suckles a litter of six. The stock boar Hove-
rign, by King David, and out of Country Lass
906 (also a daughter of Mistress 4th) is two
years past. He is of immense length, and has
good bone, and is of a quiet disposition. From
him most of the young stock are descended.
At present, Mr. Davis offers three choice
young boars, fit for service, and five under five
months old, as well as a dozen young females,
and with good success will soon be in a position
to supply a big demand from a splendid
lot of sows richly bred.

Among the Berkshires we saw a good type
of a boar, Royal Lad 4014, by Royal Herbert
2402, and out of Lady 2872, now three years old.
He was bred by Thomas Teasdale, Orono.
Being closely related to many of the young
females, Mr. Davis offers him for sale, and
from his superior length and depth of body,
good substance of bone, and grand markings,
he should be valuable to many of the better
herds in this country. Among the matrons
are such sows as Royal Beauty 5377, by King
Charmer 3733, and out of Royal Beauty 3424, a
year old, and farrowed in March to Royal
Lad. Golden Duchess 2nd 5132, by Royal Duke
3811, and out of Royal Duchess 2385, is now
two years old, and as a producer of good ones
has fully distinguished herself. She is smooth
in quality, deep and evenly fleshed, and very
active. Garbutt Bell 2113, by Victor 2nd 1718,
and out of Belle of Whitty 2nd 1445, is a four-
year-old sow possessing unusual size, and of
even quality. She has raised two litters a
year and was due again in March. A yearling
daughter of Snell's Highholers 6th 4474, by
Enterprise 1878, is in the herd, and all through
her pedigree is the most fashionable families
in the breed. At present Mr. Davis has for
sale a bunch of four and six months' females,
and one six months' boar, and is booking
orders for spring arrivals of both breeds. The
stock generally is in a healthy and vigorous
condition, their management being such as to
produce those conditions.
